s college girls from Minnesota's University of St. Thomas, led by women from the archdiocesan discernment house of Our Lady of Sorrows, pulled their van into our front drive, Angela Neumann said: "This is so exciting. One of us might have a Passionist vocation!" Then turning to Ane Kirstine Wynn, Angela added, "You might have a Passionist vocation!" In the next few days, her words proved prophetic, as Kirstine found herself being drawn profoundly to our contemplative Passionist spirit and vocation.

Having completed her masters degree in Catholic studies, Kirstine continued to discern with us by returning here two years later for her three-month aspirancy. One month later she was eager to begin her postulancy. After a year's postulancy, she received our holy Passionist habit and a new name, Sister Cecilia Maria of the Body of Christ, and entered a two-year novitiate to prepare for her religious profession as a Passionist Nun.

The longed-for day finally arrived on Feb. 2, 2013, Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, as Sr. Cecilia Maria pronounced our five Passionist vows during a Mass offered by **Most Rev. William F. Medley**, bishop of Owensboro, and a number of priests. Two deacons also participated, while several Owensboro seminarians along with Dwayne Roby served the Mass.

Sister Cecilia Maria's parents, Ret. Army Col. Tim Wynn and his wife Jane, her sister, Whitney Wynn, and grandmother, Anita Holmquist, along with several close friends made the trip to Whitesville for this glorious event. Her sister, Whitney, played the violin exquisitely during the profession Mass.
