Prayer to St. Paul of the Cross:

(all pray together)

Lord God, you gave our Father, Saint Paul of the Cross, a knowledge of the unfathomable riches of the mystery of the cross, and the gift of perfect love for your Son. As we celebrate the wonders of your power, revealed in our Founder, grant that we may learn from his example and be protected by his prayers. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The first and second readings are excerpted from the Spiritual Diary of St. Paul of the Cross, written during his 40 day retreat, Nov. 22, 1720 through Jan. 1, 1721. This year we are celebrating the Tri-Centennial of the Passionist Congregation, dated from this retreat 300 years ago, for it was during this intense experience of prayer that Paul received the foundational graces of the Passionist charism and the vocation to found the Congregation.

First Reading:

Diary of St. Paul of the Cross, December 6, 1720; November 28, 1720

St. Paul of the Cross received many of his most important inspirations in the context of the Holy Eucharist. In this reading we catch a glimpse of him at prayer after Holy Communion as he begged God to help him found the Passionist Congregation. We also witness how the Lord began to answer that prayer.

Response:

Psalm 63: 2-9, by Fr. Reginald Haller, OP

My soul is thirst-ing for you, O Lord my God.

O God, you are my God for you I long, for you my soul is thirsting; my body pines for you, like a dry, weary land without water. So I gaze on you in the sanctuary, to see your strength and your glory. (Refrain)

For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise; so I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands! My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy. (Refrain)

On my bed I remember you, on you I muse through the night, for you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice! My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast. (Refrain)

Second Reading:

Diary of St. Paul of the Cross, December 7, 1720; December 8, 1720

In this reading, we witness the tenderness and fervor of St. Paul of the Cross' love of Jesus Crucified and of his fellowmen. He yearns that all could know God's love and respond in kind. Paul's own loving union with Jesus goes beyond words and is so deep that he is able to name the Lord "my Spouse Jesus."
