Celebrasing 100 Fears of Fasima: Prayer, Penance, and Passioniss Consecration

his Fatima Jubilee Year has brought us the joy of the First Professions of Sr. Lucia Marie of the Mystical Body of Christ and Sr. Frances Marie of the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus. Sr. Lucia Marie made her Profession on January 5th, the feast of our Passionist St. Charles of Mt. Argus. The Divine Bridegroom delighted His bride on this special day with the gift of snow, the first snow that we saw that winter! No one attending Sr. Frances Marie's Profession had to worry about icy roads, however. The second joyous wedding day came in the heat of summer, on August fifteenth, the feast of Our Lady's Assumption.

Our sisters are blessed to have been able to profess their vows during this Jubilee Year, a year bathed in the light of the tender love and motherly care of Our Lady of Fatima. In fact, Our Lady of Fatima, who is also known as Our Lady of Light, is the patroness of our Sr. Lucia Marie!

One hundred years ago, Our Lady asked three shepherd children, "Are you willing to offer yourselves to God and bear all the sufferings. He wills to send you, as an act of reparation for the sins by which He is offended, and of supplication for the conversion of sinners?" What is our Lady asking of us, through her many messages to these children, but this same life of conversion, prayer and penance? Each one of us is called to hear and respond to this call, a call which is alive and is as urgent today as a century ago.

Our Passionist life is likewise a call to conversion, prayer and penance: to the daily conversion of heart required by the living

of our vows; to intimate union with Our Lord in prayer, and participation in His own prayer of praise and intercession; and to penance, especially offering daily our fidelity to our vows and whatever little difficulties come to us, in union with the Passion of Jesus, for the conversion of sinners and those who do not know Christ.

During this year of reflection on the message of Fatima, our sisters have offered themselves to God, giving a vowed "yes" to the call of Our Lord to Passionist contemplative life, a "yes" to the invitation of Our Lady to conversion, prayer, and penance. Please pray for our newest Professed sisters, and for all of our sisters in formation (Stay tuned for another profession before the end of the year!). And may Our Lady of Fatima watch over all of us her children, and continue to help each of us to hear her voice and to faithfully follow her Son!


Rumor has it that our Jubilarian loves chocolate, so a rich chocolate torte was the dessert of the day.

Our monastery's patron has been hard at work finding carpenters to help us out. **Kate Mims** (right) rallied her sons


and a friend last November and trekked out here from Texas to build a bridge on one of our hiking trails leading to a shrine for St. Michael the Archangel.


