


## Barn Raisins

The stories of how St. Joseph has manifested his fatherly care and protection over us throughout the seventy-two years since our foundation are manifold, especially at the time of our relocation from Owensboro to Whitesville. Many of you surely remember that exciting and Spirit-led project, as we too remember with gratitude your generous assistance and support. It's hard to believe that more than twenty years have passed; our newest members were still babes-in-arms when the 'new' monastery was being built!

As we continue our twenty-third year in Whitesville, we find ourselves facing several maintenance needs and improvements. This year, we have added a Maintenance Supervisor to our payroll. St. Joseph brought us the perfect man for the job, Ronnie J. Mayfield (yes, 'J' is for Joseph!). We also have invested in a small utility vehicle, an invaluable help for the grounds-keeping needs of our 170 acres. Currently, we have two building projects underway, which will provide much-needed workspace for our two maintenance men, and storage and organization space for outdoor maintenance equipment.

These projects, added to the ongoing costs of basic upkeep of our monastery and grounds, have been a significant financial investment for us this year. However, convinced as we are of the necessity of these efforts at this time, we are moving forward with confidence in the guidance and help of St. Joseph. We also look to you, our faithful 'St. Joseph's helpers'. Passionist Oblate Affiliate Christie Swanson lost her oldest sister, Jean Lee Overfield, on May 23, 2017. After a day of working out in her yard, Jean suffered a stroke and died two days later.

She was an office manager for 15 years at Max Arnold and Son Petroleum in Hopkinsville. She had lost her husband just a year and a half earlier and is survived by two sons, two stepsons, one daughter, and three stepdaughters.

Jean was a gentle, kind, and compassionate woman, very active in her community and church. Many family members and friends did not realize how generous Jean had been in recent years until the day of her funeral. There they heard about how Jean was so well loved, especially by the youth. Every Wednesday night Jean provided, all by herself, a delicious home-cooked meal to about 50 youth in the surrounding community. She also loved to tutor the youth who were struggling in school. She was always there to provide a helping hand. A dear friend of Jean's told the story of how she volunteered to make a wedding meal after learning just the day before that the caterer had canceled on the couple.

### Melvin Bernard Wathen

In 1992, when Melvin, recently retired, heard that we were relocating from Owensboro to 150 acres in Whitesville, KY, he felt inspired to make one piece of artwork for the new monastery—a near life-sized bust of St. Joseph the Worker. Once he completed that project, St. Joseph really got a hold of him, and soon Melvin was carving Stations of the Cross, flower stands and candle holders for the chapel plus a small Sorrowful Mother statue for each nun's cell. That really "hooked" him on his new role as St. Joseph's Helper (he would sign his name, SJH), and he continued volunteering at least one day weekly, putting his electrical and jack-of-all-trades skills to good use for 13 years!!

Throughout these years, Melvin (sometimes with the help of his sons Steve and Dennis) began leaving his mark on nearly every area of our Chapel, retreat house and monastery. Many handcrafted pieces of artwork were made for our small Passionist Inspiration shop in

the retreat house, and several large crucifixes were mounted in various places of prayer throughout our entire structure.

On November 30, 2017, Melvin went to his eternal reward, joining the love of his life, Mary Eleanor Wathen, who preceded him in death by 6 years, and for whom he devotedly cared in her last years of illness. May the Lord reward Melvin for his unspeakable goodness towards us. Well-done good and faithful servant! Enter into the joy of your Master.
